

Kentucky is taking part in an eight-state earthquake drill and says participants should "drop, cover and hold on" at 10:15 a.m. Thursday.

The Central U.S. Earthquake Consortium organizes the annual "ShakeOut," allowing individuals, schools, organizations and governments a chance to practice taking cover. Other states taking part are Alabama, Arkansas, Illinois, Indiana, Mississippi, Missouri and Tennessee.

Here's Barren County Emergency Management Director Tony Richey, says the sirens will be activated across the county. He explains more about the exercise:
